online bidding

Since many folks will be new to online bidding, please review the information below in advance of placing your bids and raising your virtual paddle.

BEFORE THE EVENT

When the Silent Auction opens on February 12, you'll receive an email and/or a text message inviting you to start bidding.

- This link brings you directly to the Online Bidding Site, and **automatically logs you into your account.**
- **During the Gala, you will want to have this link up on a separate device** from the one you're using to watch the show.
- You will use the Online Bidding Site to both participate in the auctions and raise your virtual paddle.

Note that if you access the bidding site using a link other than the one you received by email or text, you will be able to see the packages but you will not be able to bid.

WHILE THE AUCTION IS OPEN

☰ Use the hamburger menu to open Bids, Favorites, and Categories.

☆ You can use the star on a given package to mark it as a Favorite, allowing you to view it later under "Favorites" in the menu.

🔍 To browse packages, use the magnifying glass, or simply scroll down the page.

Bids See packages that you've already bid on.

Act Now Here you can sort packages quickly by various criteria, including No Bids, Currently Open, and more.

HOW TO BID ON A PACKAGE OR ITEM

When you find a package or item that interests you, simply click on it to browse photos and item details, as well as to view the most current bids. You may bid on the package by doing one of the following:

Select "Bid" to place a single bid at the next bid increment.

"Bid More" if you wish to bid more than the next increment. Use the wheel to set your bid.

Place a **Max Bid**, in which the system will automatically bid in your favor until either you are outbid or the auction closes.

"Buy Now" to purchase the package outright at the specified price.

If you place a bid and are later outbid by another bidder, you will be notified by email and/or text message. **The Silent Auction closes at noon on Monday, February 22, 2021.**

LIVE AUCTION & PADDLE RAISE

The Live Auction features our most exciting auction items! Your bid and virtual paddle raise are an agreement to buy. You may place bids in advance of the Gala, and continue to bid during the event as the auctioneer prompts you. **Live Auction items will close during the Gala.**

You may raise your virtual paddle to donate at any time – before, during, or after the event – by selecting **"Donate Now"** on the Online Bidding Site; choose your amount, then submit.

TROUBLESHOOTING / FAQ

The link in my welcome message leads to a blank white page. What's going on?

It may be because you're using Internet Explorer. The Online Bidding Site does not work with Internet Explorer. Instead, use Google Chrome or Firefox.

Why can't I bid?

If you don't see the "Bid" button, you might not be logged in. Use the home icon (top right) to return to the homepage, then check to see if your name is at the top of the screen. If not, you'll need to log in by clicking the link in the welcome message that we sent you by email and/or text message on February 12.

If your name still doesn't appear at the top of the screen, contact us and we can resend your welcome message to the correct phone number or email address.

A fruit-forward and juicy entry leads to flavors that mirror aromas with the addition of pomegranate and a subtle hint of mocha that flow into a soft, round finish accented by balancing acidity.

As Willamette Valley Vineyards' most versatile Pinot Noir for food pairing, this wine lends itself well to spicy East Asian and Indian dishes, wood-fired flatbreads, gourmet burgers, and salmon.

STEVEN BYESS, MUSIC DIRECTOR & CONDUCTOR

Currently celebrating his sixth season as music director of Portland Columbia Symphony, Steven Byess is recognized for his musical versatility, multi-faceted presence on the

podium, and passion for music education.

In addition to his role with PCSO, Steven is the music director of the Arkansas Philharmonic Orchestra and the North Mississippi Symphony Orchestra. He is the associate music director of The Ohio Light Opera, where he has conducted over 80 productions and 21 commercial recordings. In 2000, he was selected by Walt Disney World Entertainment to conduct the NFL E*TRADE Superbowl Halftime show, where he performed for a television audience of over 120 million fans.

As a passionate advocate for the arts, Steven is a sought-after speaker, and has organized collaborations with numerous choruses, chamber music ensembles, and festivals. He wrote and co-directed a PBS presentation, *Count On It!*, designed to connect music and mathematics for children grades K-3. Since 2013, he has shared this passion with over 80,000 children around the country as a conductor of the Carnegie Hall Weill Music Institute Link Up orchestral education concerts.

Friday, March 26, 2021, 7 pm

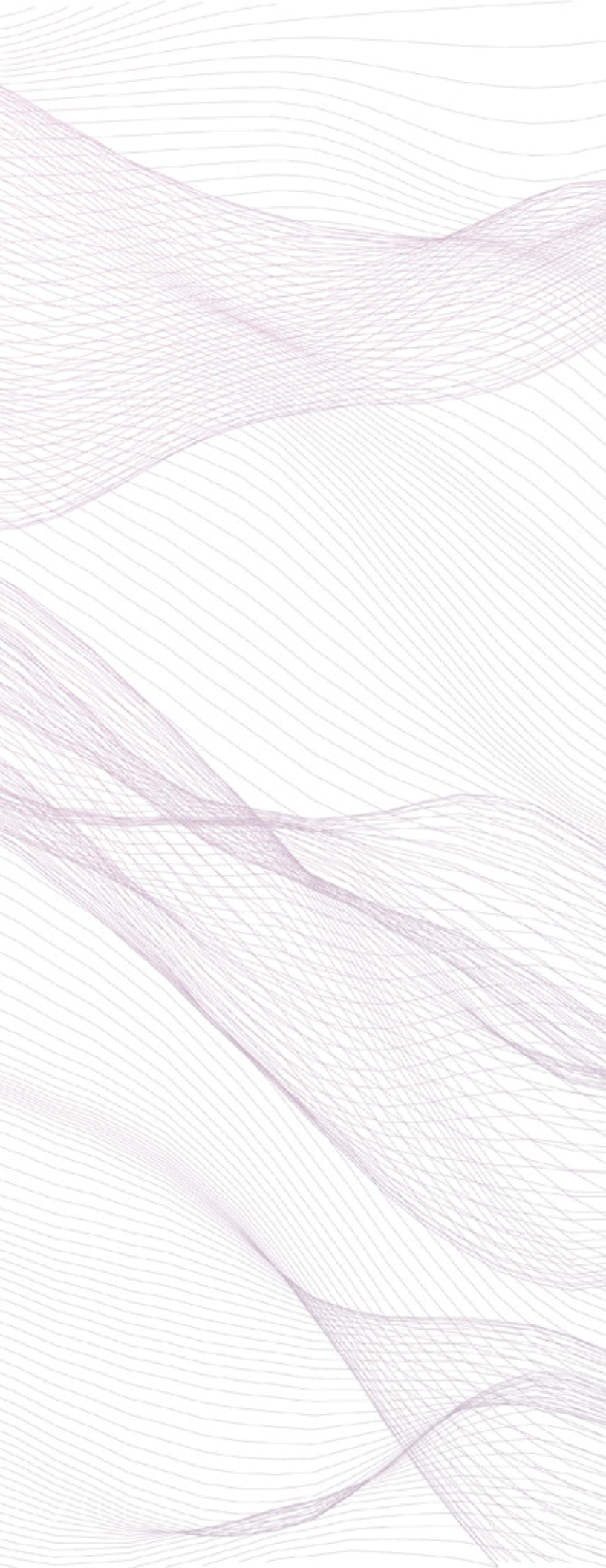
