What connects a Haydn symphony and a brand-new commission by a living composer? How do stories from centuries past still speak to us—and shape us—today?

This season, Orchestra Nova Northwest invites you to follow a throughline: a consistent thread of musical conversation stretching across generations, cultures, and continents. This season, we explore how music remembers and reimagines.

Each concert offers a powerful dialogue between the classical canon and the living voices of contemporary creators. You'll hear how Caroline Shaw draws from Haydn's wit and form, how Bernstein responds to Auden's poetic anxieties, how immigrant voices echo through Peter Boyer's *Ellis Island*, and how emerging composers like Karena Ingram and Giancarlo D'Addona Castro reflect our present with vibrant clarity.

This is music as storytelling. Music as lineage. Music as imagination.

Whether in the theatrical playfulness of *II Distratto*, the jazz-infused energy of Gershwin, or the haunting intimacy of Garūta's piano concerto, each program reveals a deeper truth: composers across time are always in conversation—with the past, with the world around them, and with each of us. Their music reminds us that we are more connected than we are separate—that across centuries and cultures, human expression continues to echo the same longings, questions, and hopes.

Welcome to season 25-26. A season that celebrates legacy and innovation, the familiar and the new.

ONN launches the season with a program that offers an exploration of musical wit and transformation across time. Portland Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Caroline Shaw's Entr'acte, inspired by the elegant surprises of Haydn's string quartets, juxtaposes classical refinement with unexpected turns. Anna Clyne's Sound and Fury, inspired by Haydn's Symphony No. 60 and Shakespeare's Macbeth, is imbued with visceral energy and literary allusions that echo both Shakespearean drama and Haydnesque contrast. At the center of the program stands Joseph Haydn's Symphony No. 60, Il Distratto, a fusion of humor and invention, originally composed for the stage. Together, these works offer a rich dialogue between past and present, revealing how composers continue to reinvent the concert experience with imagination and daring.

Presenting the Western U.S. premiere of a new composition titled Rainn by Karena Ingram, a rising star in contemporary composition. Her evocative work explores the fluidity of nature and emotion, and is presented in collaboration with the League of American Orchestras and the Toulmin Orchestral Commissions Program. Portland piano virtuoso Maria Garcia performs the dramatic elegance of Lūcija Garūta's Piano Concerto in F-sharp Minor – a hidden gem of the 20th-century repertoire, brimming with intensity, lyricism, and dazzling virtuosity. The program closes with the radiant warmth of Antonín Dvořák's Symphony No. 8 in G Major, a celebration of nature and folk-inspired melodies, bursting with joy and optimism.

The program closes with Peter Boyer's Ellis Island: Dream of America, a poignant tribute to the immigrants who shaped the American story. Blending theater and multimedia, the work features actors and projected images from the Ellis Island archives, with spoken texts drawn from real interviews in the Ellis Island Oral History Project. This dynamic work reminds us of the hopes, struggles, and dreams that built a nation.

ONN presents a program honoring the powerful legacy of LGBTQ+ composers who helped shape the classical canon. Leonard Bernstein's The Age of Anxiety-a symphony in name, a piano concerto in spirit-traces a soul's search for meaning in a fractured world. Inspired by W.H. Auden's Pulitzer Prize-winning poem, the music journeys through introspection, disillusionment, and, ultimately, hope, with the solo piano as its restless, poetic voice. ONN welcomes the return of dazzling pianist Sara Davis Buechner in her fourth appearance with the orchestra. The program also features Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5 in E Minor-a deeply emotional work that weaves darkness and light, struggle and triumph. Often seen as a reflection of Tchaikovsky's inner life, it builds to a powerful, redemptive finale. ONN celebrates these two remarkable composers. honoring their courage to live authentically when their identities were often marginalized.
